Wild Swans and Geese of Northern Europe: A Tribute to the late Peter Scott

The UK and Ireland are the most important countries for wintering wild swans and geese. The legacy of Sir Peter Scott is that we pursue our duty of conservation of these magnificent birds, so that they return healthy to their far north breeding grounds in summer and thereby help many species that in the past were in serious decline. The Deben is an estuary that has made a big contribution, particularly to the Brent Geese population.
