A Village in Crisis: Waldringfield from closure to conflict Thursday 4th April 7.30 pm

The presentation will deal with that time in the history of the village when all must have seemed lost - within five years of the start of the 20th century, the industry upon which the village had thrived was under threat of closure. The closure occurred and, within another five years, international conflict first threatened and then happened on an unimaginable scale, shattering communities throughout the land. Waldringfield was no exception. **The History Group** proposes to help its audience imagine what life in the village was like during these times.
