

# ***Waldringfield Parish Plan 2014***

## ***Initial Report on the Results of the Parish Plan Survey***



The Waldringfield Parish Plan Survey 2014 was circulated in June 2014 to all residential households in the parish. The Parish Plan Steering Group asked for your help by completing the survey and recording your experiences on a range of topics and also your comments and opinions. 147 completed surveys were returned, a very good response rate of 65%. The results have now been collated and are attached. No interpretation or analysis of the results has been applied at this stage. This initial report is simply a record of the collated data.

We are now asking for your comments on the information that has been collected. The plan belongs to us all and we need your input to ensure that we are working to a common end.

Our next step will be a Parish meeting at 7.30pm on January 29<sup>th</sup> 2015 in the Village Hall.

We hope you will come along and put your points of view. If you are unable to attend this meeting but have a question or wish to raise a point regarding the survey results please do so beforehand by writing to Janet Elliot at Mill Cottage, Mill Road or email to [janet@buttermans.com](mailto:janet@buttermans.com). Your comments will then be included in the discussions at the meeting.

Taking account of views expressed in writing and at the meeting, the Parish Plan Steering Group will then prepare a document outlining the issues that have emerged and proposing actions to be taken, whether by the local councils, by other local bodies or by voluntary groups within the village.

Many thanks for your continuing support as we work together to achieve our goal - the enhancement of our life in Waldringfield.

## ***Initial Report***

### ***Introduction***

The current Parish Plan was published in 2004. The information gathered has been used to inform Parish Council Policies and gave impetus to the formation of a variety of local interest groups.

Much has changed during the intervening years, on a national and global scale as well as much nearer to home. The move towards Localism has made it even more important for us to have an updated and expanded Parish Plan, one that is holistic in its scope and identifies the things that residents most value as well as aspects that we may wish to change or see as a challenge.

Consequently a group of 8 volunteers together with some ad hoc specialist input, formed the Parish Plan Steering Group to be the body responsible for conducting a Village Survey and publishing the Parish Plan. The Parish Council provided the limited funding that was necessary and advice was given by Community Action Suffolk.

The Parish Plan will inform local, district and county councils with the views of local residents and identify issues for action. It will be used as leverage to improve facilities and services and identify local character and features that need to be protected.

### ***Understanding the data***

In some cases respondents put a tick in a box where a number was required, e.g. 1=often, 2=occasionally, 3=never. This has been shown in the report as an additional category.

Where a respondent has filled in some of the options with numerical values but left others in the same question blank, this has been shown as an additional category.

Where percentages are shown, these are the percentages of the people who responded to the specific question, unless otherwise stated.

The number of comments has been provided where relevant, but the actual comments have not been included in this report. However, where the 'Other (please specify below)' box has been filled in, the 'other' category has been provided, with the number of occurrences in brackets.
