

## Waldringfield Primary School: Annual Report to the Parish Council

### Executive Summary

As Executive Headteacher, I am pleased to share our annual report for the 2025-2026 academic year. Waldringfield Primary continues to thrive as a small, nurturing school where individual needs are met and every child is celebrated. Our federation with Hollesley Primary remains a cornerstone of our success, allowing us to maintain our unique village identity while benefiting from shared expertise.

### Key Highlights of the Year

- **Nursery Expansion:** Successfully completed internal renovations using the DfE Nursery Grant.
- **ASSET Education Trust:** Successfully completed our first full year as part of the Trust (joined April 1, 2025).
- **Community Enrichment:** Re-established strong links with local sporting and cultural venues.

### School Structure and Demographics

Our current enrollment stands at **71 children**, organised into four mixed-age classes.

### Inclusion and Staffing

We pride ourselves on our inclusive environment, supporting a diverse range of needs:

- **Free School Meals (FSM):** 16 children (23%)
- **Special Educational Needs (SEN):** 11 children (15%)
- **EHCP Support:** 5 children (7%)

The school is supported by **four full-time teachers** and **seven teaching assistants**. By utilising our own staff for Breakfast and After School Clubs, we ensure continuity of care and a consistent "family" feel for the children throughout the day.

### Facilities and Infrastructure Improvements

The most significant physical change this year has been the **internal renovation funded by the DfE Nursery Grant**. This work has transformed our Early Years provision, providing:

- Dedicated Nursery/Reception toilet facilities.
- A new integrated kitchen area.
- Enhanced indoor and outdoor learning environments.

We currently have **4 nursery children** enrolled. Now that the physical works are nearing completion, we intend to launch a wider marketing campaign to promote this valuable community resource to families in Waldringfield and the surrounding areas.

### Curriculum, Values, and Enrichment

Our "Cornerstones" curriculum continues to engage pupils through thematic learning. We focus on the **6 Rs: Respect, Responsibility, Resilience, Resourcefulness, Readiness, and Reflectiveness**.

### **Beyond the Classroom**

We believe in providing "cultural capital" through varied experiences:

- **The Arts:** A whole-school visit to the Wolsey Theatre in Ipswich.
- **Physical Education:** Termly gymnastics trips to Piper's Vale and local inter-school football matches.
- **Community Expertise:** We remain eager to invite any local residents with specific expertise related to our termly topics to come and speak with the children.

### **Strategic Partnerships: ASSET Education Trust**

Our transition into the **ASSET Education Trust** on April 1st last year has been a positive strategic move. This partnership has already:

1. Strengthened our leadership capacity.
2. Provided professional development opportunities for our teaching staff.
3. Ensured the long-term sustainability of the school in a changing educational landscape.

### **Closing Remarks**

The relationship between the school and the village is vital. We are incredibly grateful to the Waldringfield School Association (WSA) and the wider community for their tireless fundraising and support.

We welcome feedback from the Parish Council and remain open to exploring new ways we can support or collaborate with the Waldringfield community.
