Waldringfield Parish council's response to planning application: Submitted via the planning portal on 12 Dec 204

DC/24/0448/FUL - Change of use of agricultural land for the storage of up to 49 caravans/motorhomes and associated permeable surfacing, 2x CCTV cameras, and erection of boundary fencing: Part Land At, Foxburrow Farm, Waldringfield Road, Brightwell, Ipswich Suffolk

This application originally submitted in Feb. 24. It sought permission for the storage of "up to 75 caravans".

WPC **OBJECTED** to the application for a number of reasons including:

- a) the environmental impact that would result from an operation of that scale and
- b) the "change of use of agricultural land" which appears to seek a permanent change from agricultural to commercial, thereby changing permanently the character of the land and its future uses.

Reviewing the more recent documents we note that a Preliminary Ecological Appraisal has been submitted and the number of caravans have been reduced to "up to 49", but, the applicant appears to still be applying for a "change of Use of agricultural land" on a permanent basis which is of great concern to the parish council.

However, after much discussion WPC has concluded that we would **NOT OBJECT** to this application <u>providing that any planning consent includes the following conditions.</u>

a) A condition to ensure that the planning permission is for a limited a period/number of years ie "a temporary change of use".

NB There is a precedent for this at the Foxburrow Farm site – see DC/13/2252/FUL – condition 3.

See also 6.20 of the original Supporting Statement "The proposal is also entirely reversible. Where there a time where the use was no longer required, the site can readily be returned to its former condition"

b) Enforceable conditions to ensure prior approval by ESC and delivery by the applicant of matters covered by paragraphs 5.2 & 5.3 of the Preliminary Ecological Appraisal.
